Archbishop of Canterbury's call for prayers for Lambeth Conference on Trinity Sunday

I recently received a request from the Archbishop of Canterbury for prayers for the upcoming Lambeth Conference:

The Lambeth Conference theme of 'God's Church for God's World', reminds us that we are called upon as Christians to pray for the needs of the world.

When the bishops and their spouses gather for the Lambeth Conference in July this year, they will devote time for prayer and discussion about church and world affairs.

Bishops will discuss a number of topics, including mission and evangelism, peace and reconciliation, the environment and sustainable development, discipleship, inter faith relations and more.

Meeting with bishops from all around the world, the conference will be an important opportunity to learn from one another's contexts and consider ways to work together in sharing the hope of the gospel around the world.

As the conference draws closer, we are inviting our conference delegates and their churches and communities to pray for the Lambeth Conference - and the impact it can have on the life of the Anglican Communion in the decade ahead.

Archbishop Welby has set aside Trinity Sunday (12 June) as a day of prayer for the Lambeth Conference.

Attached to this email is a prayer guide for churches and communities in their praying for the conference. It contains an outline of what the conference covers, and prayers from Anglican religious communities around the globe.

I also attach the full text of Archbishop Welby's letter calling for prayers on Trinity Sunday.

Please bring this letter, and the prayer guide, to the attention of people in your parishes and faith communities and join me in praying for the Lambeth Conference, the Archbishop of Canterbury, and all involved in preparing for the conference.
